



# What is the OLI Alumni program?



The OLI Alumni program provides Indigenous youth who have completed an OLI program access to mentorship and structured learning experiences that will support them as they transition to post-secondary opportunities.

## Why we need the OLI Alumni program

Through alumni survey data, we have discovered that despite 96% of OLI participants going on to graduate high school, almost 54% of these graduates are currently not working and not pursuing further education.

OLI Alumni express a desire to work for OLI in their communities and to attend post-secondary, but they need knowledge, guidance, and support to take the next step.

### We will offer the program through 3 different streams of learning.

## **Propeller Stream**

## **Tracee Smith Founders Scholarship**

#### Value: \$10,000

Established to honour OLI Alum, the Founders Scholarship recognizes dedication and passion for dance and education. It is awarded annually to one Alum in each program stream who demonstrates exemplary performance, leadership, and empowerment by achieving a challenging personal/professional goal and being active in the OLI community. Candidates must apply for scholarship consideration.

#### Candidates must:

- Be Indigenous (First Nation, Inuit, Metis).
- Be fully engaged in one of the 3 Alumni streams – Excelerator, Bridge, or Propellor, demonstrating a commitment to their learning through regular check-
- ins, Leadership Forums, professional development, and volunteer work.
- Submit their application by March 31, 2023.
- Include 2 3 reference letters from people who attest to the candidate's persistence, passion, and determination.
- Include records of academic progress or employment (i.e. GPA reflecting strong, consistent student achievement OR strong performance assessments based on employment)
- Include how the scholarship money will help the candidate's next goal.

- Speak about their goals, achievements, and next steps with Founder Tracee Smith in an interview.
- Have a valid social insurance number.
- Be available to attend our Annual Showcase in Toronto on May 11, 2023.



Applications open January 16, 2023. Completed applications must be submitted by March 31, with final marks to follow by the end of the school year if applicable.
